TOI Entry

LCCISC currently have 2 TOI teams, Senior and Novice. There are minimum performance skills and skating level requirements that must be approved by TOI Coaches before skaters join a team. Skaters must be a current member of LCCISC.

Minimum entry skating level

- Novice Team Intermediate 1 and above
- Senior Team Preliminary and above (at coaches' discretion)

Monday Training Sessions

Novice Team:

- 4:30pm 4:55pm Off Ice
- 5:00pm 5:30pm On Ice

Senior Team:

- 4:30pm 5:15pm Off Ice
- 5:30pm 6:45pm On Ice

Payment

Session payments include ice entry and all coaching fees. They also help cover the cost of props, costumes, and accommodation and airfares for one Coach (expected to be the Head Coach) at Interstate and International Competitions.

Payment must be made weekly by session card or cash/EFT. Skaters may purchase a session card from a Committee Member, which covers 5 sessions of TOI.

- Novice Team \$95 session card (5 sessions, saving \$5) or \$20/session
- Senior Team \$140 session card (5 sessions, saving \$10) or \$30/session

Session cards are non-refundable and will not be replaced if lost.

Skaters must pay for each TOI session, even if not attended, unless a medical certificate is provided. If the skater in isolation due to Covid-19, a clearance certificate from NSW Health must be shown for verification.

Any notification of absence due to illness or other reasons must be communicated to Michelle privately, not on the WhatsApp chat group.

Holiday leave will only be accepted if more than 1 months' notice is given.

Costumes for Competitions

TOI has 2 sections for Competitions – the Freeskate and the Choreographic Exercise, requiring different costumes.

- <u>Freeskate</u>: Costuming and make-up for Free Skate programs should enhance the feeling created by the performance and reflect the meaning of the story or theme.
- <u>Choreographic Exercise</u>: All team members must wear matching plain black outfits. Coaches will provide more detailed information as necessary.

Costumes may be hired out to each skater for a rental fee of \$40, with a \$10 refund upon return (conditions apply) or be purchased outright. It is the skater's responsibility to look after their own costume and replace it if it gets lost or damaged. All hired costumes must be returned by the end of the season.

TOI Jackets

All skaters attending competitions are expected to wear the black 'Pacific Stars On Ice' jacket. If a skater does not have one yet, they may wear the LCCISC club jacket, or a plain black jacket.

Communication

All skaters or parents need to be part of the TOI Senior and Novice WhatsApp groups, where urgent messages will be communicated. All other important communication will be sent via email.

All skaters must provide relevant details to the Team Manager for Competition Registration.

Any queries should be directed to the LCCISC Committee, Team Manager, or Head Coach.

All TOI skaters are expected to behave in accordance with the LCCISC Skater Code of Ethics and Guidelines. Parents of TOI Group Skaters are expected to comply with the LCCISC Parent Guardian Other Code of Ethics and Guidelines. These can be found on the LCCISC Website.

Skaters are not permitted to share any images on social media or otherwise of costumes, hair, or makeup before the first competition of the season.
